Natasha, who plans to take a degree in fine art from the University of

the Fraser Valley after graduating from high school in Abbotsford, was the mastermind behind the project which led to brighter days for the residents of Cottage Worthington and a Trailblazer Leadership award for Natasha. A Trailblazer Leadership Award is a prestigious award that is the culmination of a Ranger's work as a Girl Guides member. The award recognizes a girl's outstanding achievement and her commitment to the Vision, Mission and Values of Girl Guides of Canada.

CT SCANNER AT MMH ALMOST HERE



Thanks to Mr. Sukhdev Gerwal, who heard about the need for a new CT Scanner and donated \$550,000 on Canada Day — and with many other donations from our community — we are now only \$295,000 away from the \$1.3 million we need to finalize the purchase of a CT Scanner for Mission Memorial Hospital (MMH).

CT scanners are an essential diagnostic tool for inpatient and outpatient care but an emergency CT scan is crucial when diagnosing stroke patients to determine whether the stroke is hemorrhagic; caused by a ruptured blood vessel causing a bleed in the brain, or

ischemic; caused by a blood clot blocking or restricting the flow of blood to the brain.

Treatment varies depending on the type of stroke and the correct imm-

ediate treatment may minimize long term effects and even prevent death. The time it takes to transfer a stroke patient to another hospital for a CT scan can have a serious impact on outcomes, making the need for a CT Scanner in Mission a top priority for the entire community.

NEW MAMMOGRAM MACHINE WILL ADVANCE WOMEN'S HEALTH CARE

Chilliwack General Hospital (CGH) will soon be offering new state-of-the-art mammography. This health care advancement is another example of our ongoing commitment to the quality of health care in our communities.

Mammogram machines are essential tools for detecting breast cancer, the most common cancer among Canadian women. On average in Canada a staggering 76 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer and 15 women will die from breast cancer ... every day.

The new machine with a price tag of \$395,000 should reduce wait times though faster and more efficient scans because the new equipment's enhanced technology features advances in breast imaging and digital mammography.

"I am pleased to announce," says Liz Harris, executive director of FVHCF. "that the Crystal Gala Foundation whose mission is to support breast health in the Fraser Valley East have come forward and pledged to use some of the the proceeds from the annual Crystal Gala — to be held at the Tradex in Abbotsford October 22, 2022 — towards the purchase of the new mammography machine for CGH. Having the new Mammogram Machine will reduce wait and travel times for those going to Abbotsford and earlier diagnosis will mean better outcomes for most patients."
