FAKE PATIENTS, REAL TRAINING NEW LAB TO PROVIDE VITAL HEALTH CARE PRACTICE

The computerized mannequins may not be real, but the lessons learned

A new regional "simulation lab" – the brainchild of a group of local doctors, nurses and respiratory therapists – will give local health care workers a space to practise communication, teamwork and skills they use to treat sick patients.

Fraser Valley Health Care Foundation received \$370,250 from the Fraser Valley Regional Hospital District to finance initial start-up costs for new lab, which will be built at Abbotsford Regional Hospital and open next March. The aim is for the lab to be used not just by ARH staff, but by health workers and even community members from around the Fraser Valley. The lab will feature "computerized mannequins that simulate real-life scenarios," according to the foundation.



Hospital staff already take part in training exercises, but studies have shown simulation-based procedures produce better outcomes. Emergency physician Dr. Michael Yatscoff – who is a member of the Abbotsford Simulation Group that sparked the idea – noted that around 70 per cent of "patient safety events" are due to failures of teamwork and communication.

"A huge portion of these errors are preventable by fostering good communication and improving teamwork amongst health professionals," Yatscoff said in a press release. While simulation training is part of many programs and provided at spots around B.C. and Canada, the simulation group found there to be a "near-total absence of simulated training at ARH and within the Fraser East region."

The new lab is meant to address that need and create a program that is self-sustaining. The project needs another \$100,000 to reach its goal of \$500,000, which will cover the initial start-up costs and the first year of administration and operation.

WE NEED A NEW C-ARM FOR MEDICAL IMAGING

The machine gets its name because of the unique "C" like shape used to image inside structures of the human body.

Imaging is done in real time using live motion x-rays. C-arms are often used for imaging during surgery.

Examples include:

- Vascular: Arteries, veins and the stents they place within the blood vessels
- Orthopedics: Broken bones and to help Surgeon's guide their instruments
- General: Assist in removing gallbladders and looking at other organs

WHY? Our C-arm units are now over 10 years old and have to be replaced.



We use the C-Arms every day and they are wearing out. Much like televisions have experienced improved quality in the last decade, so has the C-Arm. We are now at a stage where we would benefit from improved image resolution offered by new equipment. We can

perform operations more safely, using less radiation, and see things in much finer detail for a more accurate operation, with less complications.


